## Volvic Lamp

Different pieces were cut out of Volvic's typical square water bottles using a soldering iron. The process of making curves and waves on a surface reminded Keimeyer of painting. She challenged herself by deciding not to use glue or wire for this project. The

individual pieces are mounted into each other. The idea was to create a lamp whose filigree structure reminds the viewer of a chandelier. The outward-jutting bottlenecks with remnants of the blue caps symbolize candles.



## La Rouge Pétillante

La Rouge Pétillante is made using the same technique as the Volvic Lamp, and uses red water bottles from the French company Badoit.



Johanna Keimeyer designs lamps made from recycled materials, bridging the gap between ecology and economy. From found objects which she collects all across Europe, she creates unique objects through an exhaustive work process. Her motto is that diversity, trial and error, and play (with materials, colors, shapes, structures, light and shadow) are all part of the creative route. Keimeyer's lamp creations bring a "green" piece of Berlin design into the fold.
